INTRODUCTION

The colours that Ernakulam unites are diverse, the cultures that it represents are vast, but its soul embodies the very essence of God's Own Country. Its inclusive ethos resonates in every single buildings and park here, as the people of this district represent beliefs and traditions that stretch all around the planet. While some may identify it with shopping malls, myriad restaurants and majestic skyscrapers, it also boasts of protected sanctuaries, a fine natural harbour and some of the best exponents of ecotourism in all of God's Own Country. The place has so many ecotourism attractions like Thattekkad, Mangalavanam, Paniyeli Poru, Kodanad, Abhayaranyam and many more.



Thattekkad A BIRDWATCHER'S MEAVEN

Thattekkad is definitely on most birdwatchers bucket list, as the history that emanates from its 25 square kilometre area is immense. This was the first sanctuary of its kind in Kerala, it is named after the world-renowned ornithologist, Dr.Salim Ali, the legendary 'Birdman of India'. During his ornithological survey of Travancore - Cochin, he found this wonderful site with evergreen lowland forest that is today named after him. Local tribal guides help you manoeuvre around this beautiful haven for a host of avian species.



SAFARISBoating in Periyar

The Periyar is renowned for its visuals, but viewings of the avian beings in these parts are truly special. Boat rides give you access to cormorants, kingfishers, and many other birds, which feed off fish and other small creatures in the water.

Best time for boating: February – July

Cost: Rs. 150/- for 20 persons



TREKKING Salim Ali Bird Trail

This special trail named after the sanctuaries namesake takes you on a unique hike to discover a host of birds in their chosen habitats. This includes a visit to the Butterfly Garden and the interpretation centre. Further information on the local species can be gained from the bird monitoring cell here.



SLACK BAZA TRAIL

A 3-hour hike to the heart of Thattekkad gives one a rare look at the intimate routines these species have. Birds awake your very soul with your rhythmic chirping, and an expert guide takes you around the evergreen terrain that this area is famous for. The package includes a guide, entry fee and cost of one bottle drinking water.



TROGON TRAIL

The trogon trails that Thattekkad has is among the most intriguing in the area. The guides show you where these magnificent creatures reside, and their knowledge of the place takes you to parts of the sanctuary that visitors normally have no access too.

FROGMOUTH WATCHTOWER

At night, Thattekkad truly comes to life. Its evergreen terrain is home to some of the rarest avian beings in the entire district, and visitors get to spend a night amidst the clandestine stars. The mist shrouds the area, as the forest truly comes to life from this wonderful vantage point.

This one-night stay programme covers all costs including accommodation, dinner, breakfast and any one of the bird watching trails.

MORNBILL VIEW TOWER

A panoramic view of the entirety of Thattekkad is one of the premier attractions in the area. The stay atop Hornbill tower gives one a good glimpse into the entirety of the reservoir. At night, it feels like one is right in the middle of a choir, watching a sacred abode for birds come to life.

Tree Huts are some of the most immersive tourist packages that our visitors are offered. The encapsulate everything that is special about the wild, with an in-depth look into their day to day activities.


The package includes accommodation, bird watching, dinner and breakfast.



PAID NATURE CAMP



Minimum of 15 persons is required for conducting a camp.

PANIYELI PORU

The waves fought the earnest raftsmen as they made their way across the mighty Periyar, and that is how Paniyeli Poru got its name. It lies 20 km away from Perumbavoor and 35 km from Aluva, it is the trek to the falls here that make it such a prime picnic location. The 1.5 km trek to a trail that borders the riverside is extremely beautiful. One needs to walk through the dense forest cover here, and it makes for a truly amazing site to camp as well. The site is usually more accessible when the water is low.




MANGALAVANAM SIRD SANCTUARY

Being nicknamed the 'Green Lung of Kochi', the Mangalavanam Bird Sanctuary is among the most beloved sites in all of Ernakulam. Birdwatchers throng to this green haven in large numbers due to it being a popular host for a lot of migratory birds, with a 2006 census having stated that 94 birds belonging to 32 species could be seen in Mangalavanam.

Located right in the middle of the city, it is situated behind the Kerala High Court building and is surrounded by the Arabian Sea and backwaters. Its terrain supports many types of mangroves and their associated species. Many mammals can be seen here as well, including Indian Flying-fox, Painted Bat, Eurasian Otter, House Rat and Three-striped Palm Squirrel.

The best time to visit the sanctuary is during the early summer months, especially from mid-January to early-March.



ABHAYARANYAM SCOTOURISM PACKAGES

A place where animals are taken care of with genuine love and concern, Abhayaranyam is a nature rehabilitation centre that has gained traction with a lot of our visitors over the years. Situated near Kaprikad at Kunnathukadu Taluk in Ernakulam, you have the mighty Periyar river on one side and a host of orphaned wildlife species that are being attended upon by expert trainers throughout the day. Watching these magnificent beasts being nursed back to health is a beautiful experience. One also gets to see various species of birds, butterflies, spiders and mushrooms. The place boasts of its own elephant shelter and as well as a special training centre for mahouts.

SUVARNODYANAM

Biological Ecotourism Park In Nedumbassery

Suvarnodyanam Biological Ecotourism Park is a treasure trove of leisure zones for tourists, including a Butterfly Park, Fern House, Orchidarium and Cacti Garden. Add to these a Spice Garden, Medicinal Plant Garden and Palm and Bamboo Houses, and one is sure to be entertained for an entire day. Placed near Nedumbassery, it has its own Interpretation Centre, named the Salim Ali Nature Study Hall, where one gets provisions for trekking and nature camp facilities.



KODANAD

ECOTOURISM




