Her journey began with early training under her mother and later evolved through Western Classical Ballet, Manipuri, and Kathak. With a profound thirst for knowledge, she delved into interdisciplinary studies while excelling in Bharatanatyam. Her extensive research has expanded the traditional repertoire, resulting in a rich body of work blending tradition with innovation. Honored with prestigious awards, she co-founded the Chidambaram Academy of Performing Arts, shaping generations of artists. Through her holistic vision, she has elevated Indian dance on the global stage, leaving an indelible mark on the cultural landscape.

Kerala Kalamandalam

'Amba' Specially Choreographed Mohiniyattam

Kerala Kalamandalam, India's premier public institution, stands as a guardian of Kerala's rich artistic heritage. Founded in 1930 by Vallathol Narayana Menon and Manakkulam Mukunda Raja, inspired by Rabindranath Tagore's Santiniketan, it imparts rigorous training in Kathakali, Mohiniyattam, Kutiyattam, Panchavadyam, Thullal, Mridangam, and Carnatic Music. Initially facing skepticism, Vallathol's unwavering vision prevailed, and Kalamandalam thrived. Relocating to the Nila campus in 1936, it became a hub for literary and artistic luminaries. Vallathol's legacy endures as Kalamandalam thrives, now in the Vallathol Nagar campus since 1971, preserving the essence of traditional arts and the gurukula system.

Arupa Lahiry, a Young Sangeet Natak Academy awardee, is celebrated for her Bharatanatyam with contributions, recognized the **ICCR** empanelment, "A" grade on Doordarshan, and the 2019 Overall Contribution award.
